Players and supporters returned to the clubrooms Sunday evening and celebrated with a good night. A couple of players who enjoyed the night probably as much as anyone were two who played in our last grand final in 1965 Hassa Dundas and Ray Chanter who both played well for their respective teams on Sunday.

## The Play

In the Senior game Alex. got away to a great start and virtually had the game won by quarter time with an 11 goal to 3 first qtr. Alex had seven goalkickers in this term, Britt, R.Dundas, Halligan, McKenzie 2ea. H.Dundas, Taylor and McDonald. Alex was on top in most positions with Pollard superb in the centre and McKenzie dangerous forward. Walker and Taylor were also attacking players. Scores at the first change were Alex. 11.3 to Powelltown 3.3.

Alex. continued on in the second term and with the defence led by Hortin and Mahoney were always in attack. Goals came to Pollard, R.Dundas K.Dundas, May, McDonald, and Bradley to give the Rebels a massive 20.9 to 7.9 lead at half time. Ruckmen Coonan and Hewitt were giving the rovers plenty of opportunities and H.Dundas and McDonald finished off the job in the third quarter with 3 goals each whilst Britt and Halligan also chipped in with goals. Cann cleared from the defence in dashing style as the Rebels piled on eight goals to one to lead 28.16 to 8.5 at the last change. The last quarter was a formality as the Rebels continued their dominance with Britt in top form with 4 last qtr goals and R.Dundas adding another 2.
